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#### FIRST COVID CLINIC

Mercer County Health Officer Association in collaboration with the local health departments and community partners started to vaccinate health care workers and emergency responders on December 28th, 2020, at the Nottingham Ballroom in Hamilton. Clinics will also be held at:

- West Windsor Senior Center January 6 and 8
- Princeton Senior Center January 11 and 13
- Trenton Fire Station Perry St. January 20 and 22
- Ewing Senior Center January 26 and 27
- Nottingham Ballroom Hamilton January 26 and 28.
   Mercer County Community College has pledged their

support, and the Nursing program is hoping to provide student nurses to help regularly at the two campus clinics.

Currently, vaccines are available to individuals in Phase 1A and 1B, which includes paid and unpaid persons serving in health care settings who have the potential for direct or indirect exposure to patients or infectious materials as well as residents and staff of long-term congregate settings, police, fire fighters, and Continued on page 4

## STATE SETS UP 6 VACCINATION SITES Coming Soon!



The state is administering vaccines in stages. Healthcare workers, longterm care residents, emergency responders, are currently being vaccinated, and recently, people 16-64 with chronic conditions, and people 65 and older are now eligible. Check **covid19.nj.gov/vaccine** for up to date information. The sites will be located at:

- The Meadowlands Complex in East Rutherford, Bergen County.
- Rockaway Townsquare in Morris County.
- The New Jersey Convention and Exposition Center in Edison, Middlesex County.
- The Moorestown Mall in Burlington County.
- Rowan College of South Jersey in Sewell, Gloucester County.
- The Atlantic City Convention Center in Atlantic County.

In Mercer County, vaccines will be available at the Pennington Shop-Rite, Robbinsville Shoprite, and the Henry J. Austin Clinic.

Continued from page 1: people older than 65, and people 16-64 with chronic medical conditions that pose high risk for severe COVID-19.

PREPARED ON JAN 13, 2021

As of January 14, 2021, the following groups are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine:



- Residents of long-term care facilities and other congregate settings
- Frontline first responders
- Persons aged 65 and older
- Persons aged 16 to 64 years old who have at least one chronic medical condition that poses high-risk for severe COVID-19:
  - Cancer
  - Chronic Kidney Disease
  - Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
  - Down Syndrome
  - Heart conditions (e.g. heart failure, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathies)
  - Immunocompromised (weakened immune system) due to organ transplant (consult with your doctor)
- Obesity (e.g. body mass index of 30kg/ m<sup>2</sup> or higher)
- Pregnancy (consult with your doctor)
- Sickle cell disease
- Smoking
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus

These groups can start making vaccination appointments. More groups will become eligible in the coming weeks.

#### **State Unveils Registration Portal for COVID-19 Vaccines**

The State of New Jersey's new online portal **NJVSS**, that allows people to pre-register for a COVID-19 vaccine – even if not currently eligible to receive one -- is now live. The state's website for vaccine-related information is **covid19.nj.gov/vaccine** and the registration site is **covidvaccine.nj.gov**.

Beginning January 7, uniformed police and fire personnel, and January 14, 65 year olds and older are now eligible. Once vaccine availability expands, vaccination will advance to Phase 1B, then Phase 1C, and then Phase 2, which includes the general public. The specific makeup of those later priority groups has not yet been finalized. The guidelines change weekly, so check the website for the most current accurate announcements.

When those who are not currently eligible for a vaccine pre-register through the state's new online portal, they will be placed on a waiting list and will be notified when it's their turn to schedule an appointment.

#### STICKER SHOCK

So what is **STICKER SHOCK**? Project Sticker Shock is designed to reach adults who might purchase alcohol legally and provide it to minors. Stickers warning about the penalties for furnishing alcohol to minors, are placed on all multi-packs of beer, alcopops, and other alcohol products that might appeal to underage drinkers. Youth and Prevention Coalition of Mercer County leaders approach an alcohol retailer in the community and arrange to place a sticker reminder on packaged goods. On some color boxes, the circular neon green stickers really POP out and grab your attention. Their outreach can often put stickers on 1,500 items. ### GMTMA AWARDED GRANT

**Greater Mercer TMA** is one of the five grantees awarded the 2021 Ready-to-Launch Pilot Implementation Grant by the National Center for Mobility Management. The purpose of the grant is to assist in preparing for full-scale roll-out solutions to address mobility challenges experienced by underserved community members.

Greater Mercer TMA's pilot program will offer a new transportation option for workers in Trenton, East Windsor and Hightstown to access the warehouse/distribution areas in the East Windsor/Cranbury/8a area.

The project features the use of a dynamic ride sharing app to connect workers without a vehicle with drivers heading to employment in the growing warehouse district. Subsidies and incentives, applied within the app, will make the program affordable for users. "Transit to the warehouse area is very limited and serving the sprawling development is challenging," said **Cheryl Kastrenakes, GMTMA's Executive Director.** "It's exciting to have the opportunity to put in place a new affordable option for residents to be able to reach the many job opportunities in the warehouse and distribution center area." A launch date is not set, but is targeted for the summer.
