Strategies

Host vaccination clinics in neighborhoods.

Partner with social services, employers, housing, faith-based, and other community-based organizations that serve BIPOC populations to host vaccination clinics.

Partner with EMS to provide mobile vaccination clinics in neighborhoods of high risk and/or high non-vaccination rates.

Create monthly, coordinated messaging from GMPHP partner agencies with science-based and timely information about COVID and vaccination using the trusted sources identified through the COVID survey. X

Increase participation in GMPHP by community-based organizations that predominantly serve Black African American, Latinx, Asian, and other communities of color.

Equity strategies E are identified where there is an opportunity to address social determinants of health.
